

## Produced by a local walker for all to enjoy

### **Walk 4 – A short walk** **Grade - easy** **Start point – Ty Gwyn pub** **Time – 40 minutes** **Distance – 2.0Km/1.25mls**

*Walk description – A nice little stroll around the village if all you have is 40 minutes.*

- Take the road down the side of the pub where the telephone information kiosk is located.
- After 150m go straight ahead into the field through the gate and follow the wide track.

*The house on your left in Llanerch Y Felin, the oldest house in the village, which dates back to the 16<sup>th</sup> century.*

- Carry on through a gateway and bear left on the track until you reach a gate and a stile. Go into the next field.
- Go ahead following the ruined wall/fence to your left all the way to a gate/stile and gain access to the track.
- Turn right and head along the track for 100m.
- At the sharp bend go straight ahead into the field using the stile.

*Notice the dog grave with inscription just right of the stile.*

- With the hedge to your left go to the far end of the field
- Go left over a stile and then with the fence to your right follow the path to the top of the field and then onto the road by a gate.
- Turn left.

On your left you will see a large white house called Coed Mawr Hall. The hall was built in the late 18<sup>th</sup> century. Attached to the main house was a large ballroom. The house was very ornately decorated with many period features such as murals and ornate plasterwork. In recent years (1980's) the house was used as a nursing home. After this it became somewhat derelict with much of the ornate features of the house being stripped out by the owners. Recently the last 2 owners have made great a great effort to try to restore it to its original condition. The ballroom has now been converted into three holiday homes.

- Carry on to the road T junction.
- Turn left down the hill and after 30m you will see a gate in the wall by the footpath sign. Enter the field.
- Head across the field to a point just to the right of the white house's where there is a stile over the barb wire fence.
- Go over the stile and then head for the gate.

- Go through the gate and then head down the track to the road.
- Wonder back down the village and the Ty Gwyn pub for, maybe, a well earned drink.
